Fund Purpose

The Martella Family Scholarship Fund was established to help fund higher education for:

- Martella Farms and Grower Direct employees
- Children and grandchildren of Martella Farms and Grower direct employees

Scholarship Award

The amount of this scholarship will range from \$500 to \$1,000 for one year. The purpose of this scholarship is to help pay for educational expenses such as tuition, institutional fees and books.

Eligibility

- Current employees of Martella Farms and Grower Direct must have a minimum of three years of continuous employment
- Student must attend an accredited two or four year college or university for undergraduate or graduate studies
- Student must have a cumulative GPA of a least 2.5

Selection

The Stanislaus Community Foundation Scholarship Committee, made up of independent community members/volunteers, will review and select the final applicant from all eligible candidates. Finalists will be selected based upon financial need, academic merit, and personal statement.

Award

The scholarship will be issued over the course of one academic year. Student may apply for a renewal grant for up to four years. Continuous, full-time enrollment (no fewer than 12 units per quarter/semester) is a requirement. Stanislaus Community Foundation will disburse the award directly to the university on behalf of the recipient, upon proof of enrollment (to be furnished by the student directly to Stanislaus Community Foundation).
